20 th October 2017	School Council members supported the interview process of appointing a new teacher.



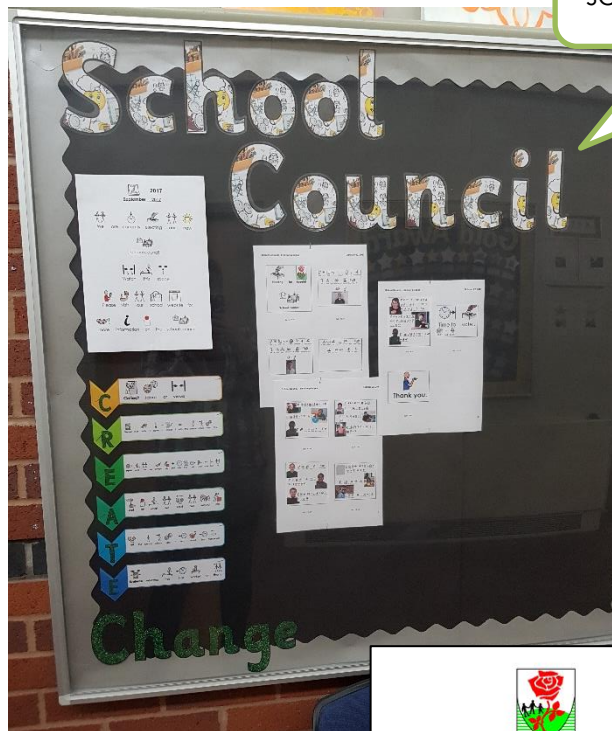

Parent/carers and community involvement:

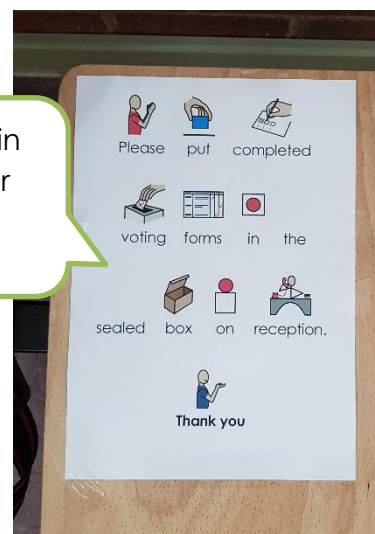
- The website has been updated throughout this project: <http://www.therosehillschool.com/rosehill-school-council/>
