Rosehill's Open Orchestra

The Nottingham Music Hub have been working with pupils who have shown an interest in and enjoy making music in a group. The pupils have been following the 'Open Orchestra' model- where pupils explore a piece of well known music and use some of the elements of that music to compose and perform an original piece of music. This year, we have had 3 ensembles from across middle and upper school. It has been a great success and we look forward to sharing our work with you in the new school year.



Visiting The Albert Hall

Pupils attended the Nottingham Albert Hall in July for the Great Big Orchestra Project. It was an inclusive interactive concert where SEN pupils from across Nottingham were immersed in music. The pupils enjoyed a 45-minute concert with interactive elements. Pupils helped to compose an original piece of music with an orchestra, and were able to move, dance and play alongside the orchestra with tuned and untuned instruments. It was a concert full of magical moments, musical challenges and sensory experiences. We can't wait to go again next year!

The School Choir

At Rosehill, we have an extremely talented School Choir who thoroughly enjoy singing and signing. The Choir practice on a weekly basis, and it is open to all ages, abilities and needs across the school (i.e., non-verbal/noise sensitive) for those pupils who show a keen interest in singing, signing and music. This year, the Choir has become extremely popular across all key stages (over 25 pupils); The Songbirds (KS1 – KS2) and The Harmonies (KS3 – KS5) have enjoyed singing at numerous events

including the Christmas concert, RSE Day, the Here to Help Fayre and the Awards Ceremony, where families enjoyed listening to the beautiful harmonies of both Choirs. Update from Hannah Scarfe in the Primary School

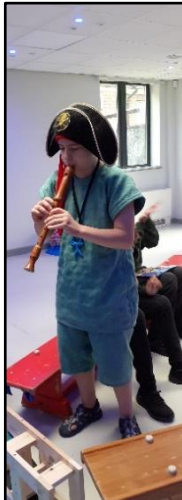
The primary children have been extremely busy this summer term creating fabulous artwork for our Pride parade and Carnival. All the children participated in these parades and a great time was had by all.

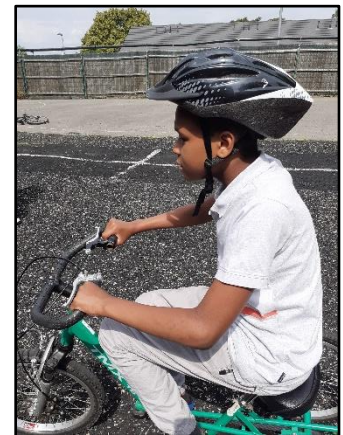

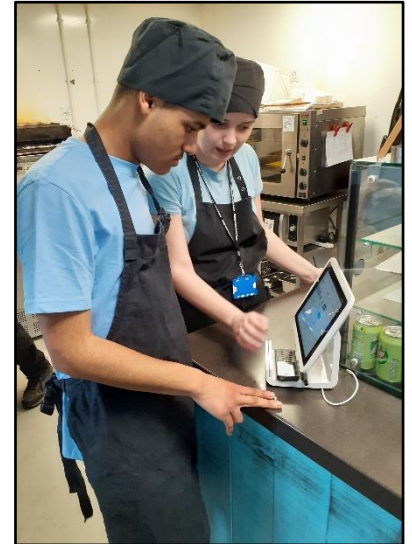
Update from Joanne Ritchie and Tamara Riddell in the Upper School

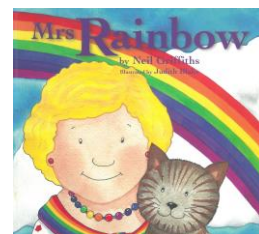

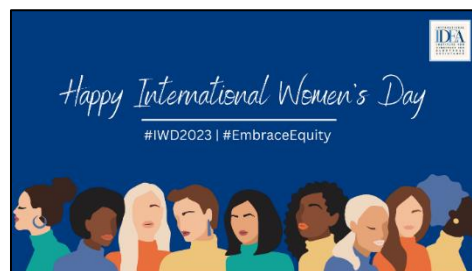


Assemblies

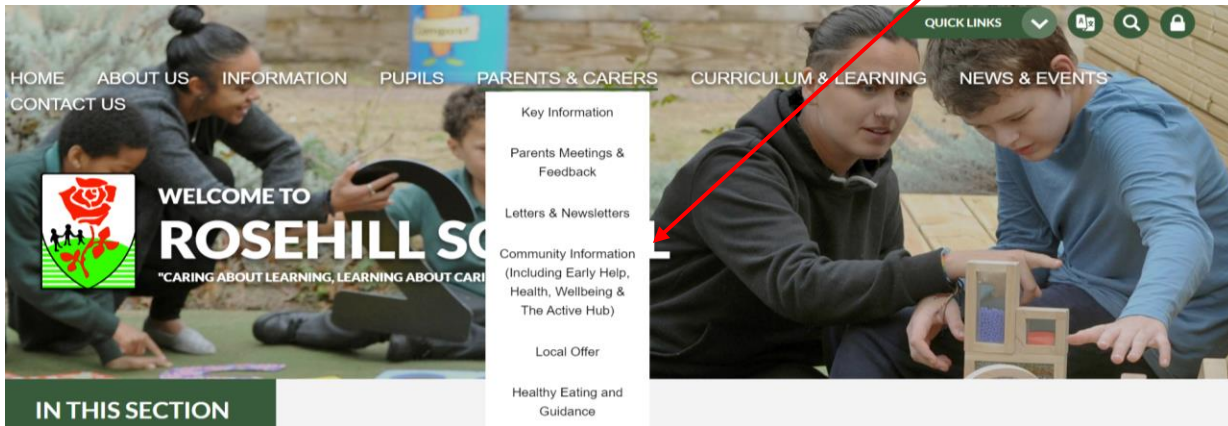

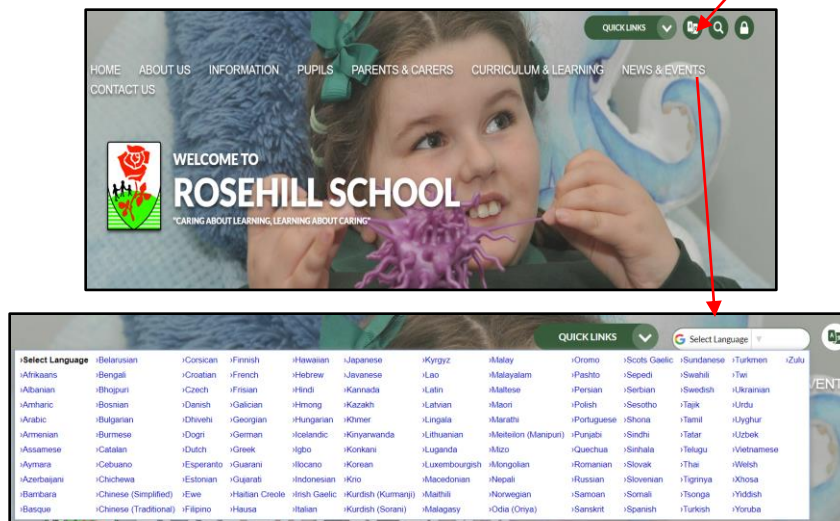
