Key Learning Objectives

At the end of the Project the pupils will have:

- Experienced how to safely cross the road in a safe and calm environment.
- Gained an understanding of road safety and the procedures they have to follow when safely crossing the road.
- Practiced how to stay safe without any cars (on the school grounds) before putting it into practice on the actual road.
- Developed their understanding of how to use the traffic light system and allowing them to be exposed to the different sounds, lights and meaning.



Project Content

This health check workshop was offered to our pupils in KS3 and above to help shape their understanding of and attitudes towards road safety. The training aims to reduce casualties on the road by giving practical training and raising observation and awareness skills while crossing the road in a safe place, before moving onto practice this in a real life situation.

Thus increasing their exposure to situations that may be quite challenging without the danger element playing apart and providing them with skills in preparation for future independent travel.

Impact on Children and Young People

All pupils were given opportunities to engage with the activity and encouraged to participate by staff.

Activities promoted being safe when out in the community and an understanding of road safety.

Evidence through learning walk/ observations

All pupils provided positive feedback during the activity and understood the knowledge that was taught.

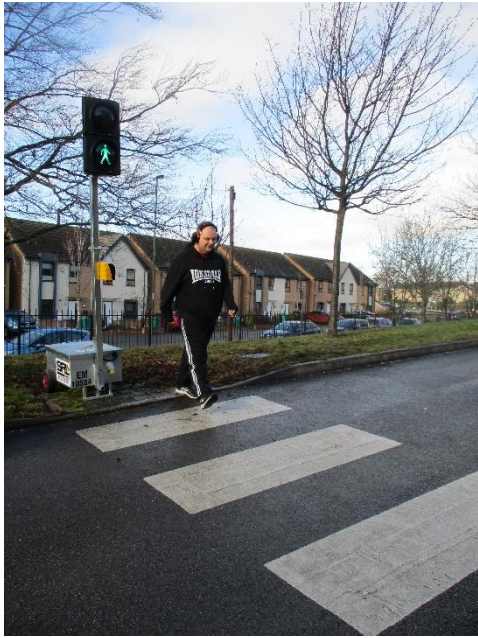

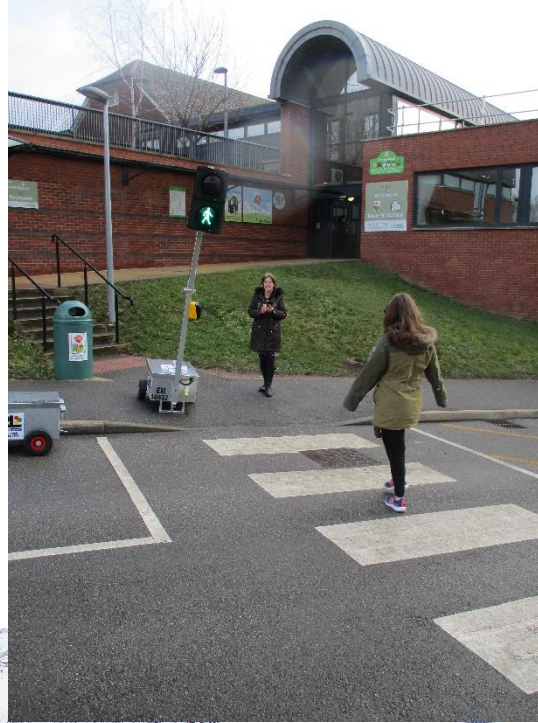
