# Key Learning Objectives

---

Anti-Bullying week is an annual event which Rosehill has taken part in since 2017. We are following the success of the campaign in 2020 – when a jaw-dropping 80% of schools marked the week reaching over 7.5 million children and young people

Anti-bullying week encourages a **whole school** approach; *“Rosehill is committed to promoting equality, diversity and an inclusive and supportive environment for its children and staff and affirms the rights of individuals to be treated fairly and with respect. We recognise that the most effective way of minimising bullying is to provide a positive atmosphere of caring and friendship, through the ethos of the school. Every child and member of staff at Rosehill School should be valued and be able to learn and work without anxiety or fear from bullying.”*

At the end of the project we want pupils;

- To feel like part of a community that stands up for the right things.
- To understand what bullying is
- To understand what to do if you feel bullied
- To understand what to do to help

Being part of a national initiative with many other schools around the country

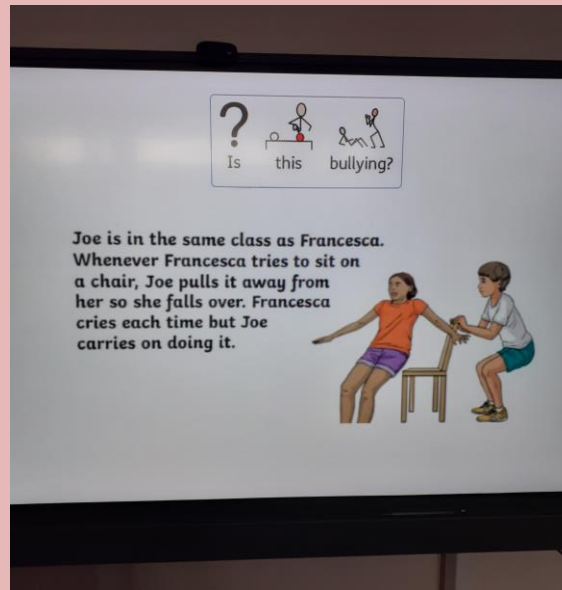
Learning Walk 17.11.21 in middle school. Class 8 having discussions about bullying and being kind
