Students also learned what they need to do if they someone else carrying a knife.



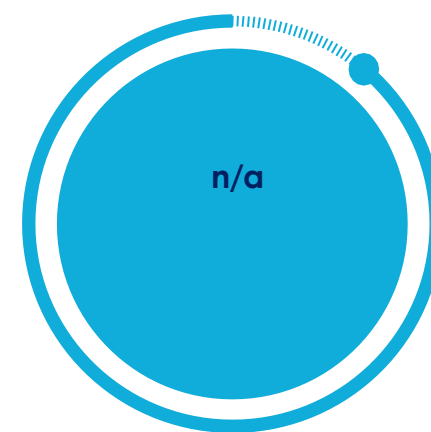
