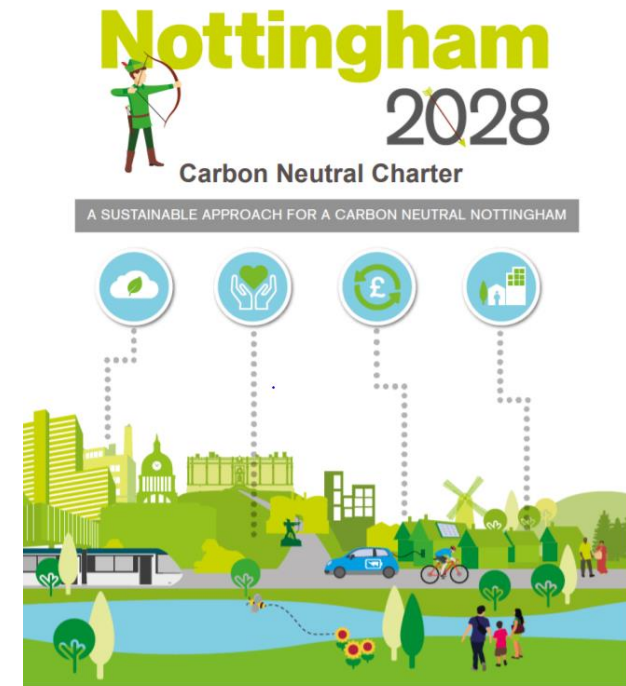


Rosehill School – Curriculum Project

Key Learning Objectives

- Reflect on the importance of living as a responsible global citizen.
- Understand the importance of COP26 and the targets they are working towards



Project Content

- Design a prototype machine which can reduce, reuse or recycle.
- Share ideas at the end of the day with children from other schools and academics from Nottingham University
