## Teaching, Learning and Curriculum Projects

---

### History - Black History Month

Black History Month was established in 1987 - on the 150th anniversary of Caribbean emancipation – and raises awareness of important names and events in the history of people of African and Caribbean descent.

During October, we shone additional light on achievements which help to build on our learning around Black History. We celebrated what this time of year stands for through the universal language of food.

Whilst remaining a valuable time to learn about the history of black people within our school community, it also gives us an opportunity to further delve into the history of African and Caribbean culture and food with greater appreciation. This year, each class explored the roots of African and Caribbean cuisines by cooking an African or Caribbean-inspired menu. Providing food for thought - quite literally - we began by exploring some of the incredible ingredients that give these cuisines their trademark taste. Pupils enjoyed cooking and tasting their dishes. One class explored Jollof rice from West Africa, whilst others enjoyed making Nigerian chi chi biscuits and Jamaican coconut cake!

We invited the CEO of Nottingham School's Trust, Pat Fielding to come and see how we celebrated Black History Month. Pat loved seeing our amazing work and held discussions with pupils about kindness and respect for others. He was then given the opportunity to judge our project and 3 classes were awarded prizes for going above and beyond in their learning – Well done to Classes 4 Sunflower, 8 Pine and 12 Rufford!



### **PSHE - Anti-Bullying Week**

We held our annual Anti-Bullying week again, where this year's theme was **Choose Respect**. All classes took part in a variety of activities to enable them to understand how to be respectful and to feel confident in helping others. Events included: taking part in team activities, reading stories relating to bullying or injustice, taking part in department assemblies, role play and learning to stay safe online. The event was launched by **Odd Socks Day**, which we celebrate because it is an opportunity to encourage staff and pupils to express themselves and celebrate their individuality and what

makes us all unique! Following the success of our Odd Socks Family competition last year, we ran another this year- well done to our winners.



### **Maths Day**

Each year we dedicate a day to Maths using all our skills and knowledge to solve problems. This year the pupils were set a challenge by the naughty little elf *Matths'ew* to get ready for Christmas. Classes helped collect the correct number of items on Santa's list before making sure they fit in the right size box and placing them on his sleigh. They measured ribbon, baked biscuits, completed an assault course to deliver Santa's gifts and enjoyed a sensory story of 'Father Christmas needs a Wee.' Classes also got creative and made some brilliant advent calendars. It was a fun packed day full of opportunities to use their maths.

### Wellbeing

During November, we participated in World Kindness Day. Pupils learnt about the importance of kindness and empathy and performed acts of kindness to spread positivity. The staff and children have been keeping kindness in mind, and they have been exchanging kindness cards as recognition for when people have either given or received kindness. The children have been doing lots of work around kindness in their classes across the school. Class 14 Newstead won a certificate

for their efforts on World Kindness Day for creating lovely kindness cups and writing kind notes to place in the appropriate cups. Class 4 Sunflower have also been adding to their kindness tree. Whenever a child is caught being kind, they are provided with a heart to add to the tree.

We didn't disappoint Pudsey Bear again this year. In total we raised **£96** for Children in Need – well done everyone!

### Harvest Festival

This year's Harvest festival was enjoyed by pupils, staff and parents. It was great to see families join us for our first after school festival where they had the chance to take part in some harvest craft, listen to an immersive sensory story and visit the café with their child. Some were even brave enough to take a walk through the spooky Halloween

The Primary School department have had a busy start to the academic year. The children are really enjoying the new playground equipment in both playgrounds. The equipment will help to promote and develop:

- ❖ Personal, social and emotional development
- ❖ Problem solving

Class 1 Rose and 2 Buttercup have enjoyed accessing the local community. Class 1 Rose have been focusing on developing their life skills walking sensibly to Stonebridge Farm to meet the animals. Class 2 Buttercup have been shopping for the class supplies at a local supermarket. The children are able to find items on the list and help scan and pack the shopping.

Class 3 Daisy have been swimming this term, where all children are now accessing the big pool and developing their independence skills when changing and dressing.

Class 4 Sunflower have enjoyed a Santa's workshop themed maths project this half term – the elves have

been busy measuring ribbon for presents, tinsel for the tree and creating Christmas cooking.



Primary School completed the term with a wonderful Christmas Performance. We are so proud of the children getting up on stage to perform their class songs. Thank you to all the families who attended.



### ***Update from Katie and the Team in the Middle School***



First of all, I would like to welcome our new pupils and families to Middle School department, as well as a warm welcome back to our existing Middle School pupils and families. We have all had a busy Autumn term getting to know our new classrooms, peers/friends, staff and department routines. During these whole department activities pupils are learning to work well with others, develop social skills, and learn to regulate themselves within a busy environment.

It has been a busy term in Upper School department. Our Sixth Form students have been involved in work related learning and enjoyed running the school café, food and book delivery service, developing office skills and supporting the primary department with maintaining their resources. Students enjoyed real life experiences and learnt essential skills.



They have had the opportunity to mix with their peers from other classes and to access lessons of their choice from a selection of visual arts, music and performing arts.

Classes have been learning about the history of Nottinghamshire and visiting places linked to class names such as Gedling Park, Wollaton Hall and Newstead Abbey. Art this term has also been linked to recreating local places of

interest. In English students have been reading and learning about A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens. They loved dressing up and acting out parts of the story!



KS4 learners have been learning road safety and independence skills and have been visiting a local café. All pupils continue to learn money skills through weekly accessing the tuck shop which is very popular and a great motivating factor!

Classes have been using Skills Builder to work on essential skills such as listening, speaking, aiming high and others. Next term, the Upper department will be focussing on the Staying Positive skill. Pupils will be engaging with the Skills Builder programme to learn how to understand feelings, stay positive and keep trying.

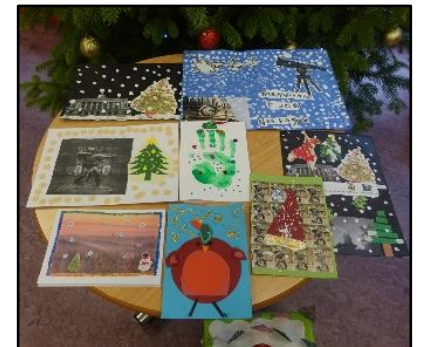
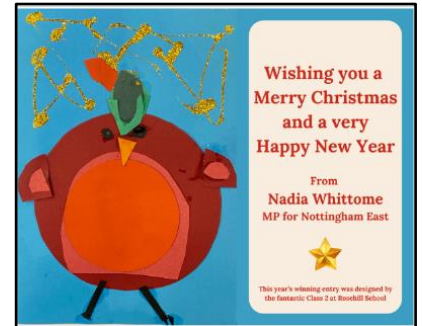
